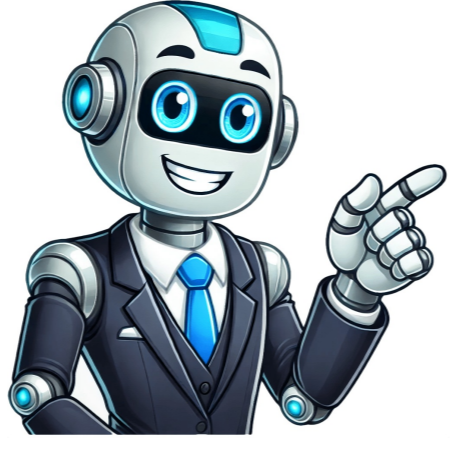

Another simple yet effective idea is to install Wifi AC/Heating remotes, allowing you to turn off lights and A/C when guests leave the room. This can help save energy and reduce costs. Lastly, consider adding a pet policy to your house rules. Some hosts share their concerns: pets can cause allergies, untidiness, damage to furniture and windows, barking at night, and lingering smells.
